Unlike most genealogical digitizations, full 16 million color and 64-bit processing will be employed. HGF members Judith Trammell and Carolyn Shimek honored the Forum by allowing us to partner. This project follows on the heels of HGF's highly successful multi-year partnership with Houston Baptist University on digitization and indexing of their family Bible records.

For those of you who love receiving reward points on your credit cards, Margaret Roberson devised the HGF rewards program: Get a Free Hour of Personal Research Help by recruiting three new (and paid) members!
